Robert O. Dulin, Jr. is pastor emeritus of the Metropolitan Church of God located in Northwest Detroit, where he served for 35 years. A graduate of Anderson University (BA) and of Central Baptist Theological Seminary (M.Div.), he is currently the Regional Pastor for the Churches of God in Southeastern, Michigan and he is also a part-time funeral home chaplain.
